

Clinical Policy: Tinnitus Treatment

Description

This policy describes the medical necessity guidelines for non-invasive, non-pharmacologic tinnitus treatment.

Policy/Criteria

- I. It is the policy of Coordinated Care of Washington, Inc., in accordance with the Health Care Authority's Health Technology Assessment, that cognitive behavioral therapy is considered **medically necessary** for the treatment of subjective tinnitus.
- II. It is the policy of Coordinated Care of Washington, Inc., in accordance with the Health Care Authority's Health Technology Assessment, that the following treatments are not medically necessary for tinnitus.
 - A. Sound therapies, including but not limited to:
 - i. Masking devices (sound maskers)
 - ii. Hearing aids with sound-generating features
 - iii. Altered auditory stimuli
 - iv. Auditory attention training
 - B. Repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation
 - C. Tinnitus-specific therapies, including, but not limited to:
 - i. Tinnitus retraining therapy (TRT)
 - ii. Neuromonics tinnitus treatment (NTT)
 - iii. Tinnitus activities treatment (TAT)
 - iv. Tinnitus-masking counseling

Background
