



Clinical Policy: Fecal Microbiota Transplantation

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Description

This policy describes the medical necessity guidelines for fecal microbiota transplantation.

NOTE: See CP.PHARM.613 for criteria for J1440-Rebyota.

Policy/Criteria

- I. It is the policy of Coordinated Care of Washington, Inc., and Coordinated Care Corporation, in accordance with the Health Care Authority’s Health Technology Assessment and Health Care Authority Billing Guidelines, that fecal microbiota transplantation is considered **medically necessary** when both of the following criteria have been met:
 - A. Member/Enrollee has *c. difficile* infection that has failed an appropriate course of antibiotic therapy.

- II. It is the policy of Coordinated Care of Washington, Inc., and Coordinated Care Corporation, in accordance with the Health Care Authority’s Health Technology Assessment and Health Care Authority Billing Guidelines, that fecal microbiota transplantation is **not medically necessary** for inflammatory bowel disease.

Background

This policy is based on Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) Health Technology Assessment (HTA) and Health Care Authority Billing Guidelines. Fecal microbiota transplantation is a procedure where donor fecal material is placed into a patient’s intestine to recolonize it with normal gut bacteria.
